

SAFETY PLAN

OVERVIEW

- Offering Ice times from July 19th to August 31st.

- We care about the health and welfare of organizers, players and community. We are dedicated to ensuring that we are diligently following all protocols of the Southwestern Public Health, the Town of Aylmer, the East Elgin Community Complex (EECC) and the Government of Ontario.

COVID SCREENING / ATTENDANCE TRACKING

- Groups will be utilizing the COVID-19 self-assessment questionnaire provided by the Province of Ontario to pre-screen before attending any ice time. <https://covid-19.ontario.ca/self-assessment/>
- Organizers will be responsible to ensure all players, parents/guardians and coaches attending have completed the COVID-19 self- assessment questionnaire in advance of participating in any on-ice activities. Failure to complete the questionnaire will result in being ineligible to participate.
- The EECC will also be screening all players, parents/guardians and coaches entering the EECC.

Below are the various scenarios and steps to be taken if...

1. Parent/Organizers/Coach Pre-Screens with a COVID-19 symptom:

- Player/Organizers/Guardian/Coach is not permitted to attend
- Player/Organizers/Guardian/Coach to contact their physician and Southwestern Public Health and follow their direction
- Player/Organizers/Guardian/Coach are required to take South West Public Health recommendations/ direction before returning.

2. Player Feels Unwell or Displays a COVID-19 Symptom at an ice time:

- Player advises Coach/ Organizer the he/she feels unwell.
- Player must physically distance him/herself from other people.
- Player will be provided with a face mask to be worn while in the facility. Anyone attending to the player will wear a face mask.
- Coach/ Organizer or other parent/guardian in audience will contact a family member/responsible person for the player and arrange for pick-up.
- Player will leave the facility immediately. If there is no family member/responsible person available to immediately pick-up the player, a place will be found to isolate the player until a family member/responsible person arrives. Facility staff will be asked for use of an isolation area.
- Player is to contact their physician and Southwestern Public Health and follow their direction.
- Player/Organizers/Guardian/Coach are required to take South West Public Health recommendations/ direction before returning.

3. Player reports feeling unwell and will not be attending sessions:
 - Player is to contact their physician and Southwestern Public Health and follow their direction.
 - Player is required to take South West Public Health recommendations/ direction before returning.
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4. Player(s) immediate family member tests positive for COVID-19.
 - Player(s) is to inform organizer and the player, as well as anyone in the player's home are not to attend any sessions.
 - Player(s) and organizer to contact Southwestern Public Health
 - Player(s) & organizer to cooperate with Southwestern Public Health regarding any actions necessary.
 - Player/Organizers/Guardian/Coach are required to take South West Public Health recommendations/ direction before returning.
5. Player(s) on same ice or cohort (bubble) test positive for COVID-19:
 - Organizer to contact Southwestern Public Health
 - Public health authority guidelines will determine contact tracing and isolation requirements. It is possible, therefore, that one diagnosis could lead to all players/parents/guardians having to be isolated and activities paused until the public health authority determines it is safe to return.

FACILITY - EECC RETURN TO RECREATION SAFETY GUIDELINES

- All ice times will be run out of the EECC. The EECC is jointly owned by the Town of Aylmer and the Township of Malahide. All organizers/players/coaches have received and reviewed the policy and guidelines of the East Elgin Community Complex.
- Below are the main guidelines all Players/ organizer/Coaches are to follow as part of the EECC safety plan:
 - Patrons will enter through the main entrance on the south side of the building.
 - Patrons will exit through the south east doors of the Kinsmen rink, following the floor markings.
 - Physical distancing is to be practiced at all times.
 - Face masks are to be worn indoors at all times. Players can remove masks once their helmet is put on in the dressing room.
 - Spectators are permitted into EECC; physical distancing is encouraged while in the building.
 - Dressing rooms are available for use, physical distancing is encouraged while in the room.
 - Up to 25 players permitted on the ice at one time.
 - Only the EECC main lobby, lobby washrooms and Kinsmen Arena will be open.
 - Participants are allowed in the facility 15 minutes prior to each session and must vacate the EECC within 15 minutes of the session ending.
 - Participants may bring a water bottle that is labelled with their name on it for their personal use (not to be shared). Water will not be provided by the EECC, so participants are encouraged to fill up at home.
 - Players/coaches must not spit, blow their nose freely or release any bodily fluid anywhere in the facility due to an extremely high risk of virus transfer.

- Players/Parents/Guardians/Coaches are required to complete a COVID-19 screen and mark attendance upon entering the EECC.
- Hand sanitizer is readily available at the EECC.

ON-ICE SAFETY GUIDELINES

- Ensure on ice activities are being ran in a safe, physical distancing environment.
- Coaches/organizers will have the authority to send any player home that is exhibiting signs of illness.
- Strictly enforce that each player uses their own water bottle with no sharing.
- Organizers to encourage physical distancing on the bench.
- Constantly monitor updates from Southwestern Public Health, the EECC and the Government of Ontario.
